The Chowgule college library is equipped with technology for the 21st century which enables the library to be linked worldwide, and thus facilitates easy access to end users. The Library is spacious and encompasses Reading Rooms, Book stacks and Specialist Function Area such as Video Room and Multimedia Resource Center.

LEARNING RESOURCES:

Library has a collection of 65,000 items covering every field of knowledge. It subscribes to 70 journals. The special collection includes Books, extensive Reference materials, 345 videos, Rare books and Photo Collection. More than 3215 bound volumes, about 767 dissertations submitted by Final year students are also housed in the library. Local and National Newspapers are available for reference.

STUDYPLACES:

Study Places are available on First floor which can accommodate 100 students at any given point of time.

LOCATINGRESOURCES:

The library Catalogue is automated and Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is available 24x7 through the College Portal.

Users can:

- Search books by author, title, subject, keyword.
- Identify whether the book belongs to Lending/Reference collection.
- See the Status (Issued/Available) of the reading material.
- Reserve reading material.

Books are Classified and arranged Subject wise on the shelves. SPCC Library follows Dewey Decimal Classification system.

Current journals are displayed on the ground floor. Library Staff would be happy to assist you in locating reading materials.

INFORMATIONLITERACYPROGRAMME:

Library conducts information literacy sessions on a regular basis to help users identify information resources for study and research purposes. Training is provided to enable users access online resources viz. full text databases, repositories, e-books, e-journals etc.

INFORMATION SERVICES:

Some of the important information services provided are Current Awareness Service, Document Delivery Service, Bibliography and Reference service. Library has access to INFLIBNET and BRITISH COUNCIL resources.

CYBERLIBRARY:

This facility is located on Library ground floor. This has provision of over 99 Study places, where users have desk with ample reading space and also a computer terminal with internet access. These study places provide seamless access to digital learning resources with printing facility.

MEMBERSHIP PREVILEGES:

The Library currently offers Membership to Students, Faculty, Staff, Retired Faculty and General Public.

Every bona fide Student of the College automatically becomes Member of the Library and has full access to all the facilities. Students can borrow up to 20 books for 7 days. Reference books, journal bound volumes are not issued out.

Fines: There will be over due charges of ₹10/- (1 to 3 days), ₹20/- (4 to 15 days), ₹30/- (16 to 30) days and more than 30 days ₹50/- per day from day one.

LIBRARY FACILITIES TO GENERAL PUBLIC:

In an attempt to widen our sphere of activity, the library is now open to general public. The College Library is a Reference and Research library and does not lend Academic items to general public.
